# The impact of your donations

Charitable funds which we often refer to, are the sums of money which are donated by you, our community.

Whether you make a donation to the general charity fund or to a specific ward or project, your donation makes a difference that is felt and experienced by our patients, families and staff.

Here are some key donations which have made significant impact to the patients of mid and south Essex.

### Investing in the lives of patients with inherited cardiac conditions

Thanks to a generous legacy gift, £46,000 has funded a 12-month pilot scheme for an Inherited Cardiac Care (ICC) Nurse at Basildon Hospital.

The new role is critical in providing face-to-face care for patients with known, and sometimes unidentified hereditary heart conditions. This funding is already improving outcomes and reducing the risk of missed symptoms that otherwise could prove fatal.



Emma, photographed above, centre has a story which highlights the importance of this role. Diagnosed with Dilated Cardiomyopathy, Emma's life was saved, in part by ICC nurse Amy (photographed left), who identified her

deteriorating condition during a clinic visit. This led to an urgent heart transplant, saving Emma's life and providing vital support for her two daughters, one of whom is now also being monitored for a hereditary heart condition.

Previously, patients had to rely on phone consultations or travel to London for care. With over 400 patients already seen at Basildon's Cardiothoracic Centre, this nurse-led programme is providing life-changing, often life-saving, care. The pilot scheme hopes to secure permanent NHS funding to continue this vital service in the future.

#### Cancer hair care

Thanks to community donations, the charity was delighted to provide £20,000 of funding to launch a new and specialised cancer hair loss support scheme at Southend Hospital for patients across mid and south Essex.



This initiative offers comprehensive care throughout the hair loss journey, including workshops on hair and wig care, one-to-one support for children and adults, wig and hair cuts, eyebrow and lash care, product advice, specialist staff training, and patient care packs.

The scheme aims to address both the emotional and practical challenges of hair loss, supporting patients from diagnosis to post-chemotherapy hair regrowth. Your support is truly making a difference!

### £170,000 of charitable funds contribute to the re-opening of Care of Elderly ward

Thanks to a gift left in a will by a very generous supporter of ours, Southend Hospital's Stambridge ward has reopened after a complete makeover.

The ward, which cares for elderly patients, has been transformed into a more dementia-friendly environment.

Improvements include dementia specific signage to reduce disorientation, matte woodeffect floor replaced the confusing high-shine flooring, and entire walls covered with scenes from nature to spark conversation and comfort. In addition, relatives rooms have been created whilst improved storage options allow staff to keep areas organised and tidy.



Once a dark and gloomy space, the ward is now bright, welcoming, and reminiscent of happy outdoor experiences. This vital charitable funding has created a supportive, safe environment within an acute clinical setting, greatly enhancing patient care.

#### Outdoor play area gets a special makeover

Thanks to over £50,000 of charitable funding and corporate donations from **Beaverbrooks Lakeside**, Basildon's children's wards now have a new play garden area for patients and their siblings.

Play is known to positively impact children's recovery, and this outdoor space offers families a sense of normality during hospital stays.

The safe, secure, and low-maintenance garden provides a stress-relieving environment that can be enjoyed in all weather, helping to reduce anxiety (and sometimes boredom!) for children and their families during challenging times.



#### **Children's Burns Club goes camping**

In May, the charity-funded Children's Burns Club hosted a two-night mini camp for ten children aged 8-11 who have experienced trauma from burn injuries.



The camp offered fun activities, team-building, and the chance to overcome fears with the support of club psychologists.

Beyond camps, the club provides support groups, counselling, larger residential trips, and fundays for families treated at Broomfield's burns department. For many families, the club is a vital lifeline, boosting children's confidence and creating shared experiences with others in similar situations.



# Appeal updates

Southend Hospital Charitable Foundation's Essex-wide campaign to share the aims and benefits of their current appeal has seen it reach £495,000! Our community's enthusiasm for jumping on-board to support this appeal is something we and the foundation will never be able to give enough thanks for.

Completion of the £600,000 appeal will see Southend Hospital home to new Surface Guided Radiation Therapy (SGRT) technology. The equipment will mean that Southend's Radiotherapy department will be able to offer patients with cancer the latest in radiotherapy delivery. Benefits of SGRT are extensive; greater accuracy, the reduction of imaging and waiting times, elimination of tattoo placement marking and closed face masks being replaced with more patient-friendly open masks for those with head or neck cancers.

The Foundation trustees wish to convey their thanks to the people of Southend and beyond. Individuals, companies and local groups have taken the appeal to their hearts organising music festivals, charity balls and coffee mornings.



**The Orpheus Singers'** Festival of Female Voices saw them raise £590. The unwavering support of this choir group has been appreciated by the foundation for many years.

Jazz-loving supporters were treated to a night of live music courtesy of **Eric Watts**' second Jazz night in Brentwood which raised over £900.

## Your impact at Basildon Hospital

#### James takes on Snowdon

When James Matthews was just four, he was diagnosed with an absent Anterior Cruciate Ligament in his right knee. After surgery in 2021, James received intensive physiotherapy at Basildon and Broomfield Hospitals.



Grateful for the care that made his knee stronger than ever, James (now eight) decided to take on his biggest challenge yet - climbing Mount Snowdon in October 2023.

This dedicated schoolboy's efforts raised over £800 for the Paediatric Therapy units. What a superstar!

#### Another hole in one from Noah's Big Charity in support of NICU



In August, over 80 golfers joined Richard Hobden for his 11th annual charity golf day, held in memory of his son Noah, who passed away at just 91 days old after being born prematurely in 2013. Following their loss, Richard and his wife Lydia founded Noah's Big Charity, dedicated to supporting neonatal care for babies born poorly or prematurely.

This year's event was their most successful yet, with a record turnout raising £10,805. The funds will support life-saving training and equipment for Basildon's Neonatal Unit.

### Generous donation made in memory of baby Poppy

John Hatfull has generously donated £2,005 to Basildon Hospital's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit following his participation in a charity white-collar boxing match.



The unit cared for John and his wife Lauren's twin daughters, Poppy and Daisy, who were born prematurely in 2020. Tragically, Poppy passed away at just 18 days old.

Reflecting on their experience, John shared, "Basildon NICU helped my family during the hardest time of our lives, caring for my girls as if they were their own."

Previously in 2021, Lauren raised over £6,000, also for the Neonatal unit by completing the Yorkshire three peaks challenge with a group of friends and family. John and Lauren's continued support at Basildon Hospital is a beautiful tribute to Poppy's memory.

After undergoing four surgeries and six months of chemotherapy, Craig (photographed centre) and his friend Mike organised a charity golf day to support the hospital's stoma care and chemotherapy units.



The father of two said: "My family's world was turned upside down when we received the shocking news of my cancer diagnosis. The hospital teams were there to support us, I can't fault a single thing those fantastic teams do for patients and families in similar situations to mine."

#### Primary school donates over £5,000

After a decision by the Earls Hall Primary Schools' student council to select Southend Hospital as their charity of the year, charity mascot Buddy Bear made a special visit to the school to meet the fantastic young fundraisers and tell them more about how their hard work benefits their local community.

#### Broomfield doctors raise over £34,000 for Emergency services

A group of fourteen, including doctors from Broomfield Hospita, I completed an extremely tough National Three Peaks Challenge through high winds and heavy rain to raise funds for Broomfield Hospital's Emergency Department.



Over 36 hours, they climbed Ben Nevis, Scafell Pike, and Snowdon, covering 3,064 meters of ascent. Their goal to raise £30,000 for an additional ultrasound scanner to improve patient care was a great success.

One of the walkers, Dr. Ajay Thomas, Consultant in Emergency Medicine at Broomfield Hospital, emphasised the growing demand on their services, with annual patient numbers nearly doubling since 2010. "The addition of another ultrasound scanner will greatly benefit both our staff and patients. We are so immensely grateful for the community's support in helping us provide even better care to our patients."

### Parents fundraiser in memory of their daughter

Amie and Aaron Stephens from Maldon raised over £10,000 for Broomfield Hospital's baby bereavement suite in memory of their daughter, Havana, who passed away at birth in September 2023.

Supported by family, friends, and colleagues, they hosted a golf day to fundraise in their daughter's honour.



Amie said: "Staying in the Blossom Suite with Havana meant that we could cherish the small amount of time we had with our daughter; we were able to introduce family to Havana and capture special memories of our time together.

"I can't imagine having been without the team at such a time. Since the loss of Havana, we've both met with other bereaved parents and were shocked to find out that not all parents get this level of support in the UK. Ensuring that other parents get access to this level of support is crucial, we're so pleased that we were able to raise such a significant sum of money to help the unit continue its work."
