Celebrating our charity partnerships

Celebrating 75 years of the fantastic Friends at Broomfield

For 75 years, the Friends at Broomfield have been a vital part of Broomfield Hospital, raising funds to improve patient care and support staff.

With over 50 dedicated volunteers running two hospital shops, they contributed a record-breaking £104,000 in 2024 alone. Over the decades, their generosity has exceeded £1.5 million, funding essential projects and equipment.



Alison Douglas, Chair of the Friends, said, "We are honoured to support Broomfield Hospital 75 years after the charity began—helping by providing equipment and services, just as the first

group of Friends did. We strive to always support the work of our NHS colleagues, patients, and visitors by making a positive contribution to hospital life."

Their support over the years has helped provide transport incubators, stroke rehabilitation equipment, breast reconstruction support, medical training tools, and virtual reality for nervous patients.

Every one of their projects has made a meaningful difference to patient care, and their contributions are visible on almost every ward.



Lucy Thomas-Clayton, Director of Charities and Voluntary Services, said: "We are incredibly fortunate to have the Friends at Broomfield by our side. Their unwavering commitment has transformed countless lives, and we are so grateful for everything they do."

Supporting PICCPals: Comfort for Patients

We're proud to be supporting local voluntary group PICCPals with a £2,000 grant, helping them continue their incredible work providing PICC line covers for patients undergoing chemotherapy and other treatments. The sleeve covers provide a comfortable way to keep a PICC line (a thin, semi-permanent tube inserted into the arm to deliver medications) dry and protected.

Formed in 2021 with just seven volunteers, PICCPals began as a way to bring comfort to cancer patients feeling isolated during the second COVID lockdown. Now a registered charity with over 60 volunteer needle workers, they create covers for adults and children with a range of conditions, including cystic fibrosis, blood disorders, and diabetes.



Lucy Thomas-Clayton, Director of Charities and Voluntary Services, said: "We always want there to be a place for groups like PICCPals to provide such vital support to our patients.

"We know from our staff and patients that the service PICCPals so generously provide makes a real difference to patients undergoing treatments for cancer. Our contribution to materials and equipment is an investment in our patients and will allow the group to continue their great work—we appreciate them enormously."

The impact of your donations

The generosity of our community makes everything we do possible. The charitable funds we often mention come directly from your donations—gifts that change lives.

Here are some key donations that have made a significant difference for patients across mid and south Essex.

Vital support for life-saving maternity trials at Broomfield

£5,000 of charitable funds has helped launch a two-year pilot at Broomfield maternity unit to revolutionise care for birthing mothers by reducing blood loss during childbirth.

Postpartum haemorrhage (known as PPH) affects 50,000 women in the UK each year and remains the leading cause of maternal death, with outcomes unchanged in over 15 years.



This funding project will introduce Fibrinogen, a fast-acting drug shown to be more effective, easier to store, and with fewer side effects than traditional transfusions. It also offers a safer, more acceptable option for communities that decline blood products.

Dr Samantha Brayshaw, Anaesthetics Consultant, said: "Thanks to community charitable funding, we can improve the speed and safety of care, reducing the time mothers are separated from their babies and enhancing recovery."

As pilot schemes are not funded by the NHS, innovations like this rely entirely on charitable donations. Your support makes pioneering, lifesaving care possible.

Funding comfort for patients receiving cancer care at Orsett Hospital

Seven specialist electric recliner chairs have been funded for Orsett Hospital's Haematology Oncology unit, providing much-needed comfort for patients undergoing cancer treatment. These chairs feature wider armrests, ideal for those requiring a canula, and adjust up and down to assist with sitting and standing.

As many treatments require long hours of sitting, these chairs offer vital support, easing discomfort at a challenging time for patients receiving life-saving care. The improved seating enhances the overall experience, making treatment sessions more manageable and allowing individuals to rest more comfortably.



Lead Nurse of Pathology Professions, Jodie Nightingill, shared, "These new chairs make such a big difference in patient comfort. Many of our patients spend all day in treatment, and we want to ensure they're as

comfortable as possible. These chairs provide that extra support. Our patients feel valued and invested in."

Celebrating our wonderful NHS staff! Broomfield Neonatal team goes the extra mile for our youngest patients

The incredible staff at Broomfield Hospital's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit have gone above and beyond—raising an impressive £7,546 through a 100km team walking challenge.

Inspired by World Prematurity Day, over 50 team members, including nurses, consultants, and clerical staff, collectively walked thousands of kilometres throughout November 2024 to support the tiniest patients in their care.



Neonatal Nursery Nurse Clare Kidd (above) said: "This challenge represents the long journey many of our babies face, and we're proud to take each step in their honour."

The funds raised will enhance family facilities and provide extra support for parents during their hospital stay.

Sensory trolley supports patients with dementia at Basildon Hospital

Basildon volunteer group League of Friends has funded a £5,000 Sensory therapy trolley designed to support adults with dementia and alzheimer's. The trolley includes sensory bubble tubes, lights, a projector, and speakers to transform rooms and bays into calming sensory spaces.



Jane Gilby, Admiral Nurse explained, "Some patients living with dementia become anxious and distressed in hospital. Sensory tools such as this can help to occupy, and comfort them. Fly High Ruby: Honouring a daughter's memory through running

In August 2024, Sam and Pete Goldring from Leigh-on-Sea tragically lost their daughter Ruby, just six days after her premature birth.

Supported by Southend Hospital's bereavement midwife Amanda Cushing, the couple created cherished memories with Ruby, including hand and feet casts. The maternity bereavement's care provided comfort during their darkest days.



Running became their emotional outlet, and through their fitness clothing brand, Happystride, they've supported mental health charities since 2021. To honour Ruby, Sam and Pete will release their 'Ruby Fly High' running shorts at the end of March 2025. A proportion of proceeds from the shorts' sales will support Southend's Butterfly Suite, a dedicated space for bereaved families. "Having Amanda by our side meant the world to us. Despite everything, we created precious memories with Ruby," Sam shared.

Sarah's challenge raises funds for Butterfly Suite in memory of baby George

In January, Sarah Speer from Ipswich completed a 5k, 10k, and half marathon over three days at Disney World Florida raising £1,856 for the Butterfly Suite in memory of her best friend Beccy's son, George, who passed away at birth.



and a £14,000 laparoscopic training device for Obstetrics and Gynaecology.

The transport incubator provides a safe and stable environment for premature and poorly newborns during transfers, enhancing neonatal care. The laparoscopic device will help train staff in keyhole surgeries for conditions such as ectopic pregnancies, ovarian cysts, hysterectomies, and removing scar tissue. This advanced training will improve minimally invasive surgical outcomes and patient care.
